

3D Blood Droplet (Large)



Size (6.5mm) 3 needles & Chunky wool

Cast on 12 stitches

Row 1 – Purl	Row 29 – Purl
Row 2 – kfb to end = 24sts	Row 30 – Knit
Row 3 – Purl	Row 31 – Purl
Row 4 – (K1,M1) to end = 36 sts	Row 32 – (K2tog, K2) to end = 27sts
Row 5 – Purl	Row 33 – Purl
Row 6 – (K2,M1) to end = 48sts	Row 34 – knit
Row 7 – Purl	Row 35 – Purl
Row 8 – (K3,M1) to end = 60sts	Row 36 – (K2tog, K1) to end = 18sts
Row 9 – Purl	Row 37 – Purl
Row 10 – (K4,M1) to end = 72sts	Row 38 – Knit
Row 11 to 21 – Stocking stitch, ending on a purl row	Row 39 – Purl
Row 22 – (K2tog,K4) to end = 60sts	Row 40 – (K2tog) to end = 9sts
Row 23 – Purl	Row 41 – Purl
Row 24 – (K2tog, K3) to end = 48sts	Row 42 – Knit
Row 25 – Purl	Row 43 – Purl
Row 26 – Knit	Row 44 – (K2tog, k1) to end = 6sts
Row 27 – Purl	Row 45— Purl
Row 28 – (K2tog,K2) to end = 36sts	Row 46— (k2tog to end) = 3sts

Cut wool, leaving long strand with which to sew up and thread through 3 remaining stitches on needle.

Sew back seam.

Turn inside out once cast on edge has been reached, and stuff.

Thread wool through cast on edge and pull tight in a draw – string fashion to seal.

Knot cast on thread with cast off thread so as to secure stuffing, and thread into blood drop so as to finish.

Abbreviations K – Knit, Kfb – Knit front back, K2tog – knit 2 together, K3tog – knit 3 together M1 - pick up strand between 2 stitches and knit, knit next stitch to complete M1
